



National Award for SEN Coordination

What is the National Award for SEN Coordination?

The award was brought in by the Government in September 2009 and is intended to support the development of Special Educational Needs Coordinators. The SENCO has an important role and the aim of the award is to maintain a consistent, high level of quality training.

This course will take a year to complete on a part time basis. Much of the work is undertaken in the work place.

This practice-led National Award of SEN Coordination module is designed to give you an understanding of the skills that can be used to make a positive difference for learners with SEND, and the opportunity to practise those skills in your workplace. You'll gain knowledge of relevant theory, research and policy and the ability to critique knowledge and existing practice.

Do I have to do the award?

Government regulations require all new to role SENCOs working in English maintained schools to achieve this award. Those who became SENCO for the first time after September 2008 are required to take the award. For these SENCOs it is mandatory to achieve the award within three years of appointment.

The DfE used to provide funding for a number of new to role SENCOs each year. However this source of funding has now ceased and the fee for the course will need to be met by the school.

If you are an experienced SENCO or work in a private or independent school, the award is not obligatory. However a large number of SENCOs working in these settings are choosing to do this award as it is the new gold-standard training for SENCOs.

Can I do the award?

If you are currently employed as a SENCO anywhere in the UK or abroad, are recognised as having Qualified Teacher Status (QTS), and have a bachelor's degree - you can enrol. SENCOs who hold QTLS and are registered with the Society for Education and Training may also enrol.

If you are an employed teacher with recognised QTS and a bachelor's degree, and are interested in becoming a SENCO, you may be able to enrol. However you must demonstrate you have the full support of your head teacher and are able to meet all the course competencies.

What is the course content?

The course is structured as a series of strands which together cover the strategic context, essential knowledge and practical skills that make up the revised September 2014 NCTL learning outcomes. These strands cover the following objectives:

We have had great pleasure in contributing to the development of the revised learning outcomes for NASCO (finalised in Sept 2014). Broadly, these can be divided into:

The professional knowledge and understanding that SENCOs need of the legislative context for SEN and theoretical concepts that underpin effective leadership and practice.

Strand 1: The Context for Inclusive Education. The aims of this strand are to equip delegates with a comprehensive understanding of the background legislation, policies and evidence that set the context to inclusion and SEN provision, together with an appreciation of high incidence disabilities and how these affect pupils' learning and development.

The expertise and capabilities that SENCOs need to lead and coordinate provision effectively.

Strand 2: Developing Strategy and Policies for Inclusive Education. The purpose of this strand is to allow delegates to draw on a wide range of evidence, policy and resources to work with others to positively influence the strategic vision and commitment for the delivery of inclusive education.

The personal and professional qualities that SENCOs need to make a positive impact on the ethos and culture in schools and other settings

Strand 3: The Development, Planning and Application of Inclusive Practice This strand aims to allow an in depth analysis of a particular issue in the workplace, drawing on theory, evidence, local practice and external sources of support to design, implement and evaluate a local intervention aimed at enhancing the outcomes of one or more SEN pupils.

Strand 4: Collaboration and Leadership The objectives of this strand are to enhance skills in collaboration, leadership and staff management, by fostering an understanding of the SENCO's key role in working with multiple stakeholders. There is an emphasis on the essential nature of interpersonal relationships for effective planning and delivery of interventions, and how to enhance your own and others personal and professional development.
