## **ABOUT THE AWARDS**

Run by Teach Primary magazine, the Teach Primary awards help educators seek out the very best teaching resources to support their KS1 and KS2 pupils – with quality determined by our panel of primary experts and educators. Our nine education categories allow us to dig deep into the curriculum, and to ensure only the most deserving resources triumph. Here, we are proud to present this year's deserving winners.





### **HOW IT WORKED**

After calling in nominations across nine categories at the heart of primary teaching and learning – CPD, digital device, English, foundation, free, maths, SEND, STEM and wellbeing – we compiled a shortlist of 54 finalists (six per category).

Our expert judges were then asked to assess these finalists, scoring them according to a clear set of criteria. This enabled us to identify five-, four- and three-star winners in each category.

We also asked our readers to share with us the name of the resource, website or organisation that has helped the most to free up their teaching time, for our Workload Buster category. After totalling the votes received for each nominee, we are delighted to recognise our top three with a Teach Primary Award of their own.

## **ASSESSMENT CRITERIA**

Suitability – is the resource appropriate for use by children in primary settings?

Originality – how innovative is the resource? What does it offer that hasn't been offered before?

Educational impact – how successfully does the resource promote children's learning and development?

Value for money\* – how significantly does the benefit of the resource outweigh its cost? (\*unless resource is free)

Durability – how well does the resource withstand the rigours of use in a busy primary setting?

Accessibility - how usable is the resource for educators without extensive subject expertise?
